THE PROPERTY:

The superbly presented accommodation comprises front door leading to entrance hall with doors to the open plan sitting/dining/kitchen with beautiful shutters overlooking the communal garden area.

The fully fitted kitchen is beautifully handmade by Andy Vale Kitchens. It comprises high and low units, built in electric oven with hob above, Belfast sink with tap over, space for fridge freezer and washing machine. The dining area has space for a table to seat four people which is a lovely light room with a window overlooking the garden.

From the entrance hall you will also find a cloakroom, large utility cupboard and doors to the principal bedroom with built in cupboards and window to the side. The second bedroom is a lovely twin room with a window overlooking the garden area.

The bathroom is partly tiled and comprises pedestal wash basin, low-level WC and bath with claw feet and shower over, with stainless steel heated towel rail.

Outside

The property has a communal area of part lawned and paved garden. Parking for one car and is only a few steps from the beach.

NB. The property has electric storage heaters throughout has recently been painted, a new hall floor laid and new bedroom carpet. The flat is leasehold.

Thorpeness is arguably one of the most sought-after locations on the Suffolk Heritage coast. The original fisherman's village was transformed about 100 years ago when Glencairn Ogilvie decided to develop the village as a holiday retreat for well-to-do Edwardians. Inspired by J M Barrier's Peter Pan, the design by Forbes Glennie includes the ever-popular country club with tennis courts and the Meare, a shallow boating lake. Thorpeness, known probably throughout the world for its "House in the Clouds", also has its own golf course, tea room, restaurant, village store and a public house.




